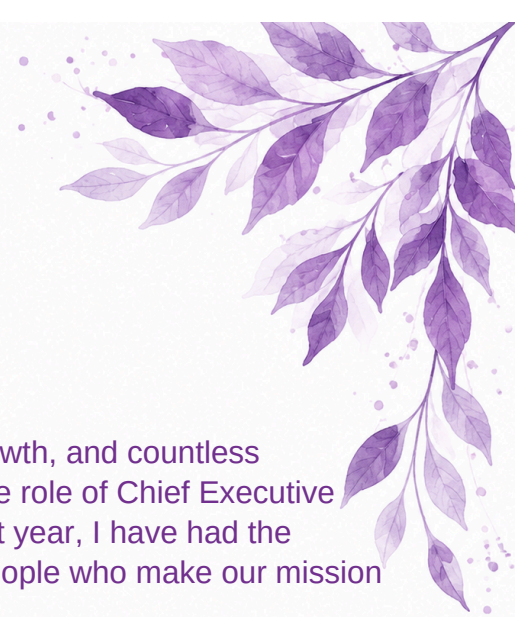

The future of MORE is bright because of all of you.

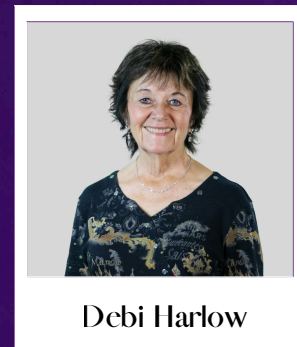
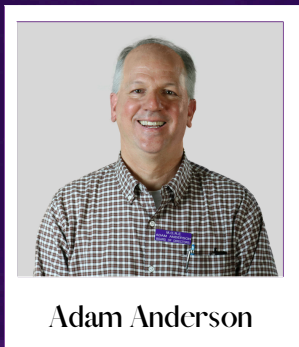
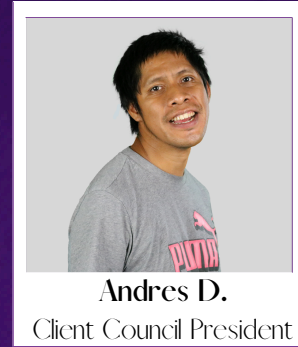

# Growing Through Community Support

## El Dorado Women's Fund Supports Culinary Training Program



Thanks to an \$8,000 grant from the El Dorado Women's Fund, MORE successfully launched and expanded our Culinary Training Program, providing individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities valuable hands-on experience in a commercial kitchen setting.

Grant funding helped purchase essential kitchen equipment, adaptive culinary tools, and supplies while also providing paid trainee wages. During the program's first year, five participants earned Food Handler Certifications and received paid, real-world job training focused on food preparation, kitchen safety, sanitation, customer service, teamwork, and workplace accountability.

The program has exceeded expectations, helping participants build confidence, develop employment skills, and take meaningful steps toward future careers in the food service industry. The success of the program has generated excitement among participants, families, donors, and community supporters, positioning the Culinary Training Program as an important and growing part of MORE's services.

We are deeply grateful to the El Dorado Women's Fund for believing in this vision and helping turn it into reality.

## The Latrobe Fund Helps Grow MORE Together

The Grow MORE Together Garden Program continued to flourish this year thanks in part to generous support from the Latrobe Fund.

The program provides participants with hands-on opportunities to learn gardening skills while building confidence, independence, teamwork, and environmental stewardship. Participants plant, maintain, and harvest fruits, vegetables, flowers, and herbs while learning about irrigation, propagation, plant identification, and sustainable gardening practices.

Produce harvested from the garden supports MORE's meal program, creating a meaningful connection between growing food and nourishing our community. Participants have also expanded their learning through visits to local demonstration gardens and ag education experiences.

Funding from the Latrobe Fund is helping MORE continue to develop the garden program and move toward a long-term vision of creating a participant-operated garden stand featuring produce, flowers, and seedlings grown by the individuals we serve.

We are thankful to the Latrobe Fund for investing in a program that cultivates both gardens and opportunities.
